Wellness Graduation Requirement

All students at the University of Richmond are required to complete URAware (WELL 085 - alcohol awareness course) and two PLUS2 (WELL 090) courses. URAware must be completed by the end of your first year of matriculation and PLUS2 courses should be completed by the end of your sophomore year. Failure to complete the WELL 085 requirement by the end of your first year of matriculation will result in a registration hold being placed on your account. This hold will prevent you from registering during priority registration.
